



(WHAT) Mindset, paradigm shift or 'pivot', personalized active learning spaces to engage the wide spectrum of where students are.


- Learner choice and education 'ownership'

- Identifying with larger student 'communities'




Conditions for Learning



Social-Emotional Learning

The ability to have **body awareness** and recognize sensations in the body.

Gaining sensory-motor integration is an important skill for managing transitions, changing routines, increasing alertness for learning, and improving regulation.




The ability to **recognize** and **manage** one's emotions.


Regulation skills build positive self control, positive self-discipline, and impulse control.





Whole Child Learning










Benefits for Staff and Learners

 - a. grass, carpet, and visuals









Have a VISION That Challenges Your Design Lens




Invest in the learner that hasn't started school yet.

Pivot your thinking for growth tomorrow.




RESPONSIBILITY to be RESPONSIVE With DESIGN

A positive culture understands space, realizes potential of all, and is connected with culture and climate. Leaders need to dream bigger than what they ever experienced as a learner!




